BUSINESS & MARKETING REPORT

This past season has been extremely successful, across a range of key business and marketing metrics. We have expanded our partnership program, increased membership numbers, and introduced a range of initiatives to improve our member experience.

Furthering the previous work undertaken by former Business and Marketing Director Christine Cougan and her sponsorship and marketing committee, the club was able to define a clear partnership program that has attracted several quality partners as sponsors, with all being on multi-year agreements. These partners, all prominent local and national brands, have committed to supporting Sorrento Surf Lifesaving Club for many years.

Support from major partners Woodside (via the state Nippers program) has continued, as has the support from the City of Joondalup. This year several new partners came on board, including ASB Marketing, Shaw and Partners, Vaikobi, My Foodie Box, Nine Plus, Magic Coat Foundation and TGI Fridays.

Having identified a need to enhance the member experience, given the size of the club and requisite member needs, the club also expanded its front of office capability this season, by providing additional resources to Administration Manager Jess Hampton, with the employment of Libby Vickery in an admin support role.

This has yielded immediate benefits, with Jess able to focus her attention on strategic value generating board led opportunities, such as sponsorship management, the development of a new website, enhancement of the lifesaving/ education function, etc, with Libby assisting with the management of the large volume of day-to-day tasks. The board is confident the restructured front of office function is now "fit for purpose" for a club of our size.

On behalf of the board, I would like to thank Jess and Libby for their tireless support of our club and its members this season.

We continue to be one of the largest clubs, based on membership, in Western Australia.

Across all member categories we focus on participation, education, and skills training. Thanks to continued strong volunteer involvement we can provide extensive opportunities for our members in each of these areas.

Our Dolphins program, which is focussed on providing an inclusive "surf club" experience for people with mental and physical disabilities continues to expand, both in terms of volunteer participants and program members. I would also like to acknowledge and thank Rita Berry and Leigh Nash for the considerable work they have put in to running our uniform shop. Having introduced a new bathers range, the first time this has been done in several years, and expanded our clothing range, the uniform shop has been busier than ever and we look forward to expanding our range further in the coming season/s.

Our Constitution Committee, made up of Ken Jenner, Adam Duffy and Karolien Belmont have played a key role in aligning our constitution to that of member needs and statutory requirements and for this we acknowledge our thanks.

Our Life Member committee, made up of Russell Wright, Rob Doherty, Andrew Ridley, Terry Colby and Murray Geneff has played a key role in driving the culture and direction of our club – to which we are very thankful.

I also would like to thank the tireless work of the My Foodie Box Watermans To The Wall committee for your continued fundraising activities on behalf of our club. This event has grown to be one of the leading WA open water swim events. In 2023 we raised more than \$5,000, all of which will be applied to the purchase of lifesaving equipment.

Shaw and Partners Race Week returned to Sorrento Beach in November 2022, with this year's event being one of the biggest yet. Showcasing some of the best ski paddlers in Australia, the week saw much activity in and around the club. The event generated a considerable return to the club, with funds applied to the purchase of a shipping container for much-needed storage.

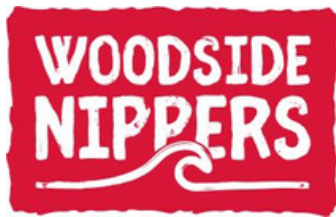
This year the club was successful in securing grants from the following:

CLUB SERVICES REPORT

As the state exited lockdown and restrictions eased, we focussed on creating a welcoming space and hub for our members. This resulted in large numbers on Wednesday nights, Friday nights and Saturday mornings for breakfast, with various athlete groups, Indian Ocean Paddlers, and community groups mingling together.

Midway through the season, we lost our Bar Manager Ramona and welcomed back our chef Bernadette. During this time, Libby has taken on office hours to assist with the admin side of rostering, ordering, and enquiries. We also welcomed back Alana and Jody to the kitchen to assist Bernadette.

This season saw a large increase in purchase spending due to an increase in the costs of our food ingredients, products, and alcohol. During the last 12 months, we have kept all our prices to our members low and affordable resulting in smaller revenue margins across the board. Our focus has been producing high-quality food at a cost that's affordable to members.

For the last 12 months, we have opened So Café six mornings a week to service our members who have wanted a coffee after training. This has been a positive move to retain staff due to staff shortages in the industry but this has resulted in higher wage costs.

Core Objectives of Sorrento Youth Program

The key objective of the 2022/23 season was to continue the momentum from the prior season:

- Maintain momentum being created with Sunday Sessions & Club Swims. Maintain focus of these sessions on training, lifesaving, surf sports and fun activities.
- Maintain momentum being created with Social Activities and look to introduce an annual Youth Camp run by Sorrento SLSC.
- Promote youth engagement in surf sports and training year-round.
- Promote and encourage Age Managers and Parents to continue to be involved as Age Managers after leaving nippers and for those interested to pursue coaching certification.
- Improve youth and parent understanding of the YIPs and YLP programs.
- Improve connection with U19's and develop their involvement in the Youth Program (Coaching, Age Managers, Officials)
- Continue to build on the momentum from 2021/22 season of the Youth Ski Development Program.
- Introduce a Youth Surf Boats and IRB Development Program and training sessions.
- Follow the lead of McDonald Patrol (Gary Bunford, Patrol Captain) with the appointment of the club's 1st Youth Assistant Patrol Captains.

Key highlights:

- Youth membership in 2022/23 season was up from 174 to 202 (+16%).
- Sorrento SLSC Youth Incentive Program (YIPs): 82 Youth enrolled in the Sorrento YIP program in 2022/23: Up from 60 in 2021/22. Of the 82, 53 Youth have actively accrued and reported their points this season; remainder have existing accrued points.
- SLSWA Youth Leadership Program (YLP): Numbers that Joined this season: Three Youth Officials (down from 8 that joined the year before) – One completed 22/23 and Ten Youth Trainers (up from 5 that joined the year before) – Five completed 22/23

Eight Youth Age Managers (equal to the 8 that joined the year before) – One completed 22/23.

Five Youth Coaches (down from Nine that joined the year before) Two completed 22/23.

Three Youth attained Gold Level in YLP; Three Silver.

- Sorrento Youth ran the TOAD Camp Session at Sorrento Beach in Jan 2023 for the 2nd year in a row for SLSWA.
- 2022/23 season average for the number of Youth attending Sunday Sessions ~ 65 youth (U14-U17) – peak was 102, slightly up on 2021/22 season.
- Twenty one Youth undertook the Five-Day Introduction to Ski's Course in 2022/23 season (up from 20 in 2021/22) – the impact of the program will happen next year in competition with the April 2022 squad now able to compete in the 2023/24 season. This should see at least 8-10+ new ski athletes come through on skis in the U17's next season.
- Focus on Lifesaving skills through Sunday Sessions created momentum to enter six First Aid Teams; 1 x U17 Champion Patrol Team; 8 x Champion Life Saver athletes in SLSWA State Championships, with 3 x First Aid Teams, 1 x Champion Patrol Team and 1 Champion Lifesaver qualifying and representing Sorrento in Aussies. Up from 4 Athletes competing in Champion Lifesaver in 2021/22 season.
- Adventure World Youth End of Year Social Event – Sixty youth attend the day compared to thirty two in 2021/22.
- Youth Surfboats Program driven by Rebecca Ferrier started in 2022/23 season and now has two Female U19 Crews and one Male U19 Crew. Great to see Youth back in the Surfboats
- Ten Active / Regular Youth Age Managers for Sunday Sessions; five others are generally able to be called on in an emergency. What was fantastic was to see three of the Mums become involved as Age Managers!!
Congratulations and many thanks to all who supported us. Sunday Sessions were represented generally 50/50 by male / female parents.

The Youth committee ran a number beach and information sessions to engage with the U13 Age Group to ensure that they and their parents are well informed of the range of activities available to those nippers progressing to Youth for the 22/23 season. We look forward to them joining us for what promises to be an exciting upcoming season.

Lifesaving Skills and Volunteering Initiatives–Bronze, SRC and other Courses
Seamlessly transitioning Nippers into SRC qualified Lifesavers is a critical activity in retaining Youth as they transition from U13s (Nippers) to U14 (Youth).

This serves several important functions:

- Ensures a stream of SRC qualified lifesavers to bolster the ranks of existing patrols at the beginning of each season
- Fulfil the aspirations of a significant number of Nippers who look forward to becoming Patrolling members of the Surf club
- SRC / Bronze qualifications are a minimum requirement for those Youth who wish to compete

The 2022/23 season saw a Youth led SRC Program conducted for the first time. Youth developed and ran its own Youth SRC Course program. With three courses conducted over the season a total of 64 Youth received their Surf Rescue Certificate qualification. This course was supported by both Youth parents as well as Youth and is a fantastic development in the Youth space. The delivery of these courses also resulted in a number of those who delivered the courses receiving their Youth Trainer and Trainer qualifications. Many thanks to those supporting the creating the next generation of Life Savers and well done to those who achieved training qualifications.

Sunday Morning Sessions

The Youth Age Managers worked tirelessly during the 2022/23 season to provide structured Sunday sessions under the guidance of the Club Development Officer and Senior Age Manager. One of the key challenges is how to provide a range of activities that appeal across the U14–U19 spectrum. While Nipper groups are focused on individual age groups, the current format of the

Youth combines the U14 to U19 age groups. The current age distribution of Youth attending the Sunday session is mainly from the younger age groups, with the Youth committee continuing to explore options to increase attendance across the age spectrum.

The Sunday session is the main point of contact between the Youth and the Club during the season. As such, activities were designed so that youth were able to explore all the possibilities offered by the club and find what suited them best as well as developing and reinforcing existing skills. Competitive and non-competitive options were offered, within a structured format.

This included:

- Sunday Morning Club Swim – Youth join seniors for the social competition of the club swim over a 200 or 400 metre course.
- Main Sunday Morning Youth Session – Youth Managers ran a 2hr mix of semi competitive and lifesaving-based activities including beach flags, beach sprints, boards, rescues, scenarios, swim and irons.
- Surf-Ski Program – A pathway for youth to learn, develop and then compete on surf-skis – Starts with Have a go Day for all Youth on Sundays, followed by option to join an Introduction to Ski's program.
- Beach training program run by Aaron / John prior to Sunday Morning Sessions, with beachies encourage to stay on and attend the Sunday Session.
- "Have a go" sessions on IRB and Surf boats
- Lifesaving and first aid scenarios
- Team building and leadership activities

In addition to the above, a number of the Youth participated in structured activities as part of the SLSWA Youth pathways program. These included:

- Youth Age Manager
- Youth Official
- Youth Trainer
- Youth Coach

Driven by the Youth Leadership Committee, there was a considerable improvement in the uptake of SLSWA Youth Leadership Program (YLP) with the program going from two youth completing YLP programs in the previous year to 10+ youth completing programs this season with two youth attaining gold level YLP. We look forward to building on this in future seasons.

Youth Incentive Program (YIP)

Again, supported by the Youth Leadership Committee, the YIP initiative increased engagement from sixty to over eighty Youth.

Some of the volunteering aspects included:

- Assistant Age Managers for Nippers groups
- Water safety for Nippers
- Water safety for carnivals and events
- Volunteering for Dolphins Program to help our members with a disability.
- Additional patrol hours for abalone, fireworks and other events

Over 30 prizes were awarded for the season which included either Engine tops, Jackets, or backpacks. In addition, some Youth decided to carry over points to the next season.

FINANCE REPORT

The Directors are pleased to present the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 April 2023. Please note the updated report format to ensure compliance with reporting standards, not-profit status and other government requirements.

The focus for the year was to ensure the operations of the Club returned to normal following the end of trading restrictions, whilst managing several large functions and events along with the growth of the youth sports program. The future new clubrooms & building project continues to be a key to planning activities.

The club has returned a net surplus over the season of \$21,864 (vs a surplus of \$33,752 in the prior year) which was \$10,101 above the budgeted surplus of \$11,763.

Membership funds received were \$272,451 which was in line with the prior year but below our 5% anticipated growth target.

Sponsorships and fundraising increased on the prior year (and budget) with a revised model and different approach to sponsorships. Available Grants were less than the prior year (with the big grant covering the ATV not replicated), but the club did receive \$35k in grants from the City of Joondalup post the end year of the financial year. Revenue sources are noted below:

The large second order provided for a significant cost reduction and time of purchase.

Our future focus remains to have adequate funds available to contribute towards the proposed redevelopment of the clubrooms – we have committed to Council we will contribute but to \$1M (by 2026). To meet this commitment, we have been able to increase our Building Fund deposits by \$27,315 to \$979,748. The Building Levy is to remain in place until the final cost of the clubroom development and fit out is known.

1. Statement of significant accounting policies

a) Statement of compliance

b) Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical cost and do not take into account changing money values except where specifically stated.

2. Statement of significant accounting policies

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

a) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairments losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Board of Management to ensure that it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' disposal.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, excluding freehold land is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready to use.

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are recognised immediately in profit and loss.

When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation surplus relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

b) Impairment

At each reporting date the Board of Management assess whether there is objective evidence that a financial instrument has been impaired. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits, held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities cash within three months.

d) Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Sponsorship and Donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

e) Inventory

Inventory held for sale are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

f) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

g) Trade creditors and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days on recognition of the liability.
